

Free Visa to Enter Indonesia for 169 countries

Commencing on 1 March 2016 according to Presidential Decree No. 21 of 2016 regarding Visits Without Visa, Nationals from 169 COUNTRIES (Including Namibia and Angola citizens. Press release at last document) are eligible to travel into Indonesia for up to 30 days without visa. The visa-free facility can be obtained at the following Immigration Clearance Entry & Exit points:

Visa Free Entry to Indonesia for Namibian

As of 21st March 2016, Indonesia granted 169 countries including NAMIBIA to receive a 30 day visa free entry.

NAMIBIA is added for Indonesia free visa along with 78 other countries with effect from 21st March 2016.

The new law approving of these countries was officially signed by President H.E. Joko Widodo on 2nd March 2016.

This 30 day visa free entry is valid for the purpose of leisure, tourism, family, social, art and cultural, government visit, giving lecture or attend seminar, attend a meeting held by head office or Representative office in Indonesia, attend an exhibition/expo/fairs and transit. It is not valid for journalism related visit.
